Rescued Dottie's leap to stardom

Jack Russell cross is signed up for Great Britain agility team

A DOG rescued by a New Forest woman has transformed into an agility star, with a helping hand from a local veterinary practice.

Rescue pup Dottie was found wandering the streets of Limerick, Ireland, aged just eight months and was adopted by Hythe resident Linda Evans (pictured left).

Nine years later and the pair have achieved countless successes in the sport of dog agility, where handlers and their canine companions negotiate an obstacle course at lightning

Patient helpline raising standards says watchdog

DORSET'S 111 patient helpline has improved its overall rating following the latest inspection by the national care watchdog.

The non-emergency service was judged 'good' by the Care Quality Commission (CQC) having been rated 'requires improvement' in 2016 when two of its areas — whether it was effective and well-led - were found to be below par.

At the latest inspection the CQC only looked into the two areas that previously had been graded below standards and found both were now good, justifying the overall rating

Inspectors said that the percentage of calls being answered within 60 seconds had been consistently better than the national and local averages since November last year, while call back systems had improved and were more responsive to callers' needs.

had Complaints been reduced and there was a low level of serious incidents. The inspectors were impressed by how staff from the ditched 111 Cornwall service were switched to Dorset's team.

They also noted the service had introduced systems to monitor and maintain compliance with the NHS Pathways licence, and engaged with external organisations to obtain feedback to evidence

where needed improving.

Staff were supported more, but the inspectors did note that while morale was up, it had recently been detrimentally affected by "recent changes in the service provision and uncertainty of the imminent tendering result regarding the contract"

The 24-hour telephone line is run by the South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (SWASFT) and serves a population of 1.3m people living in Dorset who need non-emergency medical advice over the phone.

It is free and is supported by highly trained advisers as well as experienced nurses and paramedics, who provide health information or assurance as to what callers should do next.

Ken Wenman, SWASFT chief executive, congratulated his staff, adding: "This is a fantastic achievement and is the result of a lot of hard work by everyone involved in delivering this service.'

Ruth Rankine, CQC deputy chief inspector of general practice, said: "People who call the NHS 111 service are entitled to quick and easy access to healthcare advice and information, or access to urgent attention when that's appropriate."
